

Flask Tasks Server

- A basic server that:
 - Connect to a database that contains a series of tasks
 - For each task provides information such as
 - task description and task priority
 - Can show
 - a single task
 - all the existing tasks
 - Can create a new task

Flask Tasks Server



Resources

- Identify the resources to expose
 - Task
 - Represents a single task with its own information
 - Each task is identified by a unique id
 - Tasks
 - The set of tasks available

REST service design

- URLs built on resources
 - /api/v1.0/tasks → the collection of tasks

- How to represent a single task
 - They are identified by a unique id
 - /api/v1.0/tasks/22 \rightarrow the task with id=22

Tasks

- GET /api/v1.0/tasks
 - return all the tasks in JSON
- GET /api/v1.0/tasks/22
 - return task #22 in JSON
- Example

```
{
    "task": {
        "description": "call Giovanni for AmI project organization",
        "id": 22,
        "urgent": 1
    }
}
```

Tasks

- POST /api/v1.0/tasks
 - create a new task
 - an id is assigned automatically to the newly created tasks
 - task description and priority in JSON
- Example of the HTTP request body

```
{
  "description" : "This is a new task",
  "urgent" : 0
}
```
