

- #1: Visibility of system status
- #2: Match between system and the real world
- #3: User control and freedom
- #4: Consistency and standards
- #5: Error prevention

- #6: Recognition rather than recall
- #7: Flexibility and efficiency of use
- #8: Aesthetic and minimalist design
- #9: Help users recognize, diagnose, and recover from errors
- #10: Help and documentation
